

# Final Examination Regulation

## Forward

According to the Ministerial Decree n.270/04, the Aerospace Engineering Degree Programme Board activated a diversification of the Final Examination thesis in a ‘Standard Thesis’ and a ‘Major Master’s Thesis’.

The following articles regulate the two options students can select from and indicate the necessary procedure for the Aerospace Engineering Degree Programme Board for the different thesis options.

## Art. 1 Thesis options

The differentiation between ‘Standard Thesis’ and ‘Major Master’s Thesis’ has been activated. The difference involves the contents, developed more deeply in the ‘Major Master’s Thesis’, the temporal commitment, which is estimated in 6 months full-time for the ‘Major Master’s Thesis’, and the different evaluation of the theses themselves, since the ‘Major Master’s Thesis’ also requires the assignment of an Examiner.

## Art. 2 Points assigned for the different types of Thesis

During the Final Examination, between 0 and 4 points are assigned to the ‘Standard Thesis’. To the ‘Major Master’s Thesis’ the points assigned are between 0 and 7. In both cases, points include possible approximations.

## Art. 3 Examiner Designation

The Internship and Thesis Preparation Committee is responsible for the designation of the Examiner (please see the specific regulations) according to the terms laid down in the art. 7 of the aforementioned regulations.

#### **Art.4 Submission of the Thesis**

Students who opted for the 'Major Master's Thesis' will have to submit the final version of their thesis to the Examiner at least 3 weeks before the scheduled graduation session. For the other students, the terms for the submission of the thesis have not changed, as stated in the current School regulations.

#### **Art. 5 Examiner participation during the Final Examination**

The Examiners designated by the Internship and Thesis Preparation Committee, according to the previous art. 3, are invited to participate in the specific graduation session where the theses they had been assigned as Examiners are presented. For binding and unforeseen commitments which were not planned at the moment of the designation, the Examiner is responsible for designing a substitute representing him/her during the abovementioned graduation session, who will need to provide a written report on his/her assessment of the thesis.
