SECTION 1 – ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the Second-Cycle Degree Programme in Biomedical Engineering is subject to

- possession of a **DEGREE QUALIFICATION**, i.e., a three-year university degree or diploma or another suitable qualification obtained abroad. Candidates who have not yet graduated may also apply. The application procedure is outlined in section 5;
- b) satisfaction of the **CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS** as outlined in article 1 of the Degree Programme Regulation, in section 2 of this document, and on the website at the page **Home > Admission > Programme Enrolment: requirements, deadlines and methods**;
- c) satisfaction of the **LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS** and, specifically, knowledge of English to at least B2 level, to be demonstrated according to the procedures set out in section 2;
- d) assessment of the candidate's **PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS** in accordance with the procedures set out in section 3.

An appointed committee will check the candidates' academic backgrounds and that they meet the requirements for admission.

SECTION 1.1 – CURRICULAR AND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

Possession of a degree in one of the Degree classes pursuant to Ministerial Decree 270/04, or Ministerial Decree 509/99, or Law 508/99 and have acquired university credits in the following subject groups:

A Commission appointed by the Degree Programme Board will verify the afore mentioned curricular requirements in case of a degree qualification obtained in Italy according to previous educational systems or achieved abroad and recognized as suitable.

If a candidate does not have the required ECTS, the Commission will assess whether ECTS have been acquired in other disciplinary scientific fields that can compensate for the lack of the requisites foreseen. Compensation up to a maximum of 12 CFUs are eligible during the assessment of the requirements.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted to the Degree Programme in Biomedical Engineering it is required to have an English proficiency of at least level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). Proof of meeting the English requirements need to be submitted through an eligible certification. The full list of the accepted certifications is published on the Degree Programme's website at the page Home > Admission > Programme enrolment: requirements, deadlines and methods.

SECTION 1.2 – ASSESSMENT OF THE CANDIDATE'S PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

Admission to the second cycle degree/two-year master programme requires candidates to pass an assessment of personal knowledge and skills. The assessment of personal knowledge is considered complete, for those in possession of an Italian degree, in the presence of at least one of the following criteria:

- I. Degree or University Diploma according to the previous regulations, with at least 24 CFU in the scientific-disciplinary sectors ING-INF/06 and ING-IND/34 and a Degree/Diploma mark equal to at least 85/110 or equivalent at the expiry date of the intake for the academic year of enrolment;
- II. Degree or University Diploma according to the previous regulations, with a minimum Degree/Diploma grade equal to at least 95/110 or equivalent at the expiry date of the intake for the academic year of enrolment.

For those not yet in possession of an Italian degree, the verification of personal preparation is considered complete in the presence of at least one of the following criteria:

- I. having passed graded exams for at least 162 ECTS, with a weighted average of at least 23/30, and at least 24 ECTS in the disciplinary sectors of ING-INF/06 and ING-IND/34;
- II. Having passed exams for at least 162 CFU, with a weighted average of at least 26/30.

Please remember that:

- The assessment of the personal preparation is carried out by an appointed Committee solely through
 the presentation of the required documentation, by the deadlines and procedure as outlined next.
 The Committee's evaluation on each application is unquestionable and entirely based on the
 documentation provided.
- If the above conditions are not met (in whole or in part), the verification of the adequacy of the personal preparation is to be considered as not accepted.
- In case of the presence of **real elements of exceptionality**, **evidenced by specific documentation**, the Commission appointed by the Degree Program Board will be able to define an alternative assessment path, always based on the analysis of the degree grade and of the previous career, after which it will formulate an unquestionable judgment regarding admission to the Degree Programme.
- Candidates who have not obtained the First Cycle Degree yet, but have registered at least 162 ECTS, are allowed to submit their application. If admitted, they can enrol under condition.

- <u>Students with a conditional enrolment</u> must obtain the First Cycle Degree title by the deadline set by the Academic Bodies and published on the Degree Programme's website.
- The criteria described in this paragraph also apply to those who are in possession of a university level qualification obtained abroad, deemed suitable by the Degree Program Board, for which the conversion of the degree grade according to the Italian system, the identification of the scientific-disciplinary sectors and the number of credits obtained in each sector are possible. If conversion and/or identification are not possible, the Commission appointed by the Degree Program Council proceeds to the evaluation of the career based on the documentation presented by the candidate.

SECTION 2 – HOW TO APPLY

Applications must be submitted in accordance with the following procedure:

Log into Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) using your SPID username and password. International students who do not have an identity document issued in Italy may log in using their University username and password, which can be obtained by going to www.studenti.unibo.it and clicking on *Register* and then *International Students registration*

- 1. **Click on** "APPLY FOR ADMISSION", select "SECOND-CYCLE DEGREE" and select the programme named "Biomedical Engineering";
- 2. UPLOAD the required documents in PDF format:

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- A copy of your passport.
- Self-certification regarding your first-level academic qualification with a list of the exams taken, if
 obtained in Italy, or a copy of the qualification obtained abroad which enables access to secondlevel degree programmes in the country in which it was obtained, accompanied by a Transcript of
 Records and a Diploma Supplement, where available, translated into Italian or English. If you have
 not yet obtained the aforementioned qualification, upload the list of exams taken or the Transcript of
 Records.
- Certification attesting your English language proficiency.

Remember that:

- The committee will only assess documents uploaded through the website. If there are any missing documents at the closure of the intake, the Committee will not be able to proceed with the complete evaluation.
- In case the documents' upload is uncomplete (for instance, in case the English Certificate is not submitted), the application will remain "PENDING" (corresponding to the yellow dot on Studenti Online) and will be forwarded to the evaluating Committee at the following cut-off date, given that the student uploaded the missing document.
- Documents must not be sent by mail or email.
- It is not required to attach additional documents such as Curriculum Vitae, letters of reference or statements of purpose.

SECTION 3 – ADMISSION

If you are admitted to the Degree Programme you will be notified via the website www.studenti.unibo.it as of the date indicated in the general calendar. The result will be marked by a green dot (admitted) or a red dot (not admitted). Subsequently, admitted students will receive an email to their institutional address (name.surname @studio.unibo.it) allowing them to proceed with enrolment. After the confirmation email has been sent to your institutional account, you will be able to proceed with the enrolment.

SECTION 4 - ENROLMENT

If you are admitted to the Degree Programme you must enrol starting **from February 15th, 2024**, as outlined in the general calendar. You must:

- 1. **log into** www.studenti.unibo.it entering the username and password obtained when registering for the selection procedure.
- 2. **select "Registration Enrol in a Degree Programme"**, then "Second-cycle Degree Programme", and then the Degree Programme "**Biomedical Engineering**"
- 3. **enter the required data** and attach a jpg file containing a passport-size photo of your face.
- 4. pay the first instalment following the instructions on the website www.studenti.unibo.it

SECTION 4.1 – PARTICULAR CASES

- If you have a conditional offer, remember that you must obtain your First Cycle Degree by and no later than the date established by the Academic Bodies, which will be shared upon matriculation.

 If you are a University of Bologna graduate, the IT system will automatically update the data concerning graduation after you obtain the qualification.
 - If you are graduating from a different institution, check your next steps on Studenti OnLine (www.studenti.unibo.it).
- If you hold a certificate demonstrating recognised invalidity of at least 66% or a certificate complying with Law 104/92, in order to benefit from the exemption detailed at https://www.unibo.it/en/services-and-opportunities/study-grants-and-subsidies/exemptions-and-incentives/exemptions-for-disabled-students, upon enrolment you should send the certificate via email to the relevant https://www.unibo.it/en/services-and-opportunities/study-grants-and-subsidies/exemptions-and-incentives/exemptions-for-disabled-students, upon enrolment you should send the
- If you are a non-EU citizen with EU-equivalent status and you have obtained your qualification in Italy you must provide the relevant Student Administration Office with a copy of your residence permit which confirms the EU-equivalent status.

• If you hold an international qualification, after completing the above steps, check the <u>required</u> documentation to enrol (extended link <u>https://www.unibo.it/en/teaching/enrolment-transfer-and-final-examination/enrolling-in-a-second-cycle-degree-programme-foreign-qualification</u>).

The documentation which you submitted for admission to the degree programme (e.g. diploma, transcript of records...) must be translated and bear proof of authenticity when applicable.

When you arrive at the University of Bologna, you must make an appointment with the International Student Administration Office in Bologna or the Student Administration Office for your campus in order to show the original copies of your documentation.
