 - Curriculum vitae, duly dated and signed;
 - Self-certification of exams taken, including reference to the first cycle academic record (including thesis title, grade obtained, and name of supervisor);
 - Motivation letter, including a thesis project to be started during the stay in Bielefeld.




- Miss out on meeting the eligibility criteria (or fall behind on tuition payments)
