Johns Hopkins University

• JHU founded 1876 in Baltimore by philanthropist Johns Hopkins

• 27,000 full-time and part-time students in nine academic divisions

• First research university in the United States

• 29 Nobel laureates past and present





- SAIS was founded in 1943, while WWII raged in Europe and Asia
- Sought new methods of preparing men and women to deal with responsibilities in the postwar world.
- Assembled scholars to teach international relations, international economics and foreign languages.
- In 1955 C. Grove Haines founded the Bologna Center.
 - Global institution with a permanent presence on three continents.

The MAIA

Open to students in the first year of the MA IR program

- Two Degrees: Laurea Magistrale in International Relations and the MAIA
- Take six or eight courses over two semesters (including two economics courses)
- Choose from over 75 courses each year
- Academic Writing Sessions
- Write a 20,000-words original thesis or an extended research paper.
- Language classes
- Those admitted will need 60 CFU before they being classes at SAIS

Language Requirements

Native English-speakers required to pass a proficiency exam in one of the modern foreign languages

Non-native English speakers must pass the English proficiency exam prior to graduation

The Bologna Institute for Policy Research (BIPR)

Center for Constitutional Studies and Democratic Development (CCSDD)
