

Information about applying for international exchange programmes

Applications for international exchange programmes should be carefully prepared, especially in the case of exchange destinations for which no interview is scheduled.

The following elements are relevant in the assessment of applications.

Learning plan proposal

A learning plan proposal is the list of learning activities that candidates plan on sitting while on exchange. Detailed proposals which are coherent with the candidate motivational statement will be evaluated positively, even more so if they compare learning activities of the prospective Partner University with those of the University of Bologna.

Motivational statement

Motivational statements should focus mainly on the academic reasons for applying. Concise statements (1 sheet max) written in proper English will be evaluated positively.

Language proficiency level

A candidate's proficiency level in the language required at the specific exchange destination for which they apply will be part of the evaluation. In addition to this, further certificates in the same language or in other languages may be considered, if enclosed to the application.

Further experiences

Candidates are encouraged state or certify further learning or work experiences, even if unrelated to healthcare or medicine, undertaken in or outside of their home country. Certified experiences will be evaluated positively; certificates will be considered if enclosed to the application.
