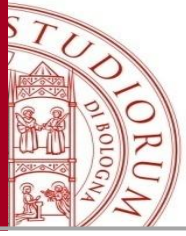

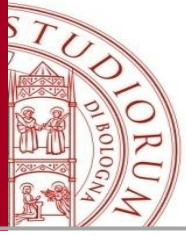

Tuition fees and exemptions

You are partially exempt if you have citizenship in a particularly poor or developing countries [.pdf 132 KB] or in non-OECD countries [.pdf 144 KB], and your family has income and/or assets only outside Italy, you are entitled to a reduced fixed fee



Before leaving home: pre-enrolment and entry visa

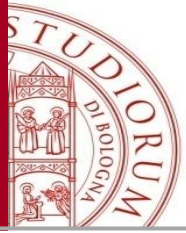

If you are a non-EU citizen and wish to study in Italy for more than 90 days, you need a Visa to enter Italy.

To apply for a visa you must:

- **pre-enrol online via the Universitaly portal**
- contact the Embassy / Consulate to find out the requirements to obtain an entry visa for "Study –Exchange and Mobility Programme" and make an appointment if necessary.

You must apply well in advance for the visa, as the visa process can take several months.

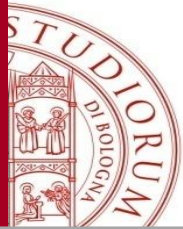


Visa procedures

If you are a citizen of a non-EU country and reside outside Italy:

- collect documentation on your foreign qualification (the time required will depend on the country in which you obtained it);
- check with the Embassy or Consulate for an entry visa: the time required to obtain one will depend on the country you come from.

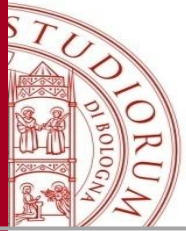

Residence permit

Apply for a residence permit **within 8 days of arriving in Italy** if:

- you are a citizen of a non-EU country and reside outside Italy;
- you are enrolling in or attending a first cycle degree programme, a single cycle degree programme, a second cycle degree programme, a Professional Master's programme, a specialisation school, a PhD, or single course units at our University;
- you have obtained a type D student visa.
