Brief overview of the degree programme

The Second Cycle Degree/Master Programme in Visual Arts is a 2-year (120 ECTS credits) free access Degree Programme with assessment of personal competencies and skills. It offers **two curricula: Arti Visive** (in Italian) and the **international curriculum in Arts, Museology and Curatorship (AMaC)** (in English and French).

The international curriculum in Arts, Museology and Curatorship (AMaC) is aimed at discussing the different methodologies in the fields of valorization of the arts, museology and curatorship in an international perspective. It provides training to students who wish to work in the various fields of the international artistic heritage and curatorship, as well as to those who plan to continue their training in schools of specialization and PhD programmes.

The teaching languages are English and French.

Candidates are expected to:

- Have acquired a good humanistic culture permitting them to contextualize the artistic events from the medieval to the contemporary period;
- Possess basic knowledge of the sources, methods and procedures of historical-artistic research;
- Be able to correctly use the main basic instruments of information technologies and telematics;
- Be able to communicate in a correct written and oral form.
- Candidates for the AMaC curriculum must have upper intermediate proficiency in English language (B2 or equivalent) and at least intermediate knowledge of the French language (B1 or equivalent).

SECTION 1 – ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to be admitted to the international curriculum in Arts, Museology and Curatorship (AMaC), candidates must:

a) hold a first-cycle **QUALIFICATION**, i.e., a three-year University degree or diploma or other suitable qualification obtained abroad complying with the requirements set in the Notice of the Ministry of University and Research (MUR) for a.y. 2024/25 which is published on the website www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/.

Candidates who have not yet obtained their first-cycle qualification and are about to graduate can apply **only for the Intake 4**. The application procedures are outlined in Section 2 – HOW TO APPLY;

- b) meet the CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS outlined in section 1.1;
- c) meet the LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS and, specifically, proficiency in English equivalent to at least
 B2 level and proficiency in French equivalent to at least B1 level, to be demonstrated according to the procedures set out in section 1.1;
- d) have their **PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS** positively assessed in accordance with the procedures set out in section 1.2.

1.1- Curricular and language requirements

CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission, candidates must:

If the candidate holds an Italian "Diploma accademico di I livello dell'Accademia di Belle Arti" (ex lege 508/99) or an Italian university degree achieved within the previous four-year system, the Admission Board will evaluate and verify the possession of the required knowledge and skills on the basis of the previous career.

For students with a qualification obtained abroad, the assessment of the admission requirements (compatibility of the degree with respect to the degree classes indicated, evaluation of the curriculum, credits and learning results with respect to the required competences and subject areas, final evaluation achieved) will take place by examining the curriculum.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the programme is subject to proving **English** language skills, equivalent to level **B2** (or higher) of the Common European Framework (CEFR) and **French** language skills equivalent to level **B1** (or higher) of the Common European Framework (CEFR).

The English language requirement may be satisfied through:

Other ways to meet the language requirement:

- Submit a self-certification stating that you are a native English speaker.
- Submit a Bachelor's or Master's degree with English as medium of instruction.

The **French language** requirement may be satisfied through:

- Native French speaker;

1.2- Assessment of personal knowledge and skills

- For candidates with Italian qualification, a final Bachelor grade of 95/110 or higher is required.
- For all candidates, an interview is required in order to furtherly assess the candidates' personal competencies and skills.

Attention: the interview is compulsory for all candidates!

The interview aims to furtherly assess the candidates' personal competencies and skills (candidates are expected to have acquired a good humanistic culture permitting them to contextualize the artistic events from the medieval to the contemporary period and to possess basic knowledge of the sources, methods and procedures of historical-artistic research).

The interview will last around 15 minutes and will be conducted remotely (in English and French).

During the interview the Admission Board will evaluate in particular:

- The coherence of candidates' previous academic studies/Bachelor's dissertation topic with the AMaC curriculum;
- The candidates' basic academic knowledge about contemporary arts, exhibitions and museums;
- The candidates' direct experience/knowledge about recent events in the arts world (exhibitions, museums, art events etc.).

SECTION 2 – HOW TO APPLY

Applications must be submitted within the timeframe set by each intake in accordance with the following procedure.

- Log onto Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>), using your SPID username and password. The system will automatically retrieve your personal details and at the end of the process it will generate your University credentials (<u>nome.cognome@studio.unibo.it</u>).
 International students who do not hold an ID document issued in Italy and, therefore, cannot obtain SPID credentials, may log in with their University username and password; to obtain them log onto StudentiOnline (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>), click on "Register" and then "International Student Registration".
- Click on "ADMISSION APPLICATION", select "SECOND-CYCLE DEGREE" and choose the programme named "VISUAL ARTS – ARTS, MUSEOLOGY AND CURATORSHIP (AMaC) – International Curriculum, Admission process".
- 3. UPLOAD the required documents in PDF format:

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- For students holding a qualification obtained outside the University of Bologna: a copy of the front and back of a valid identity document. If the identity document does not have an English translation, a copy of your passport must be attached.
- For students holding a qualification obtained outside the University of Bologna: Self-certification regarding your first-cycle academic qualification with a list of completed exams, if obtained in Italy, or a copy of the qualification obtained abroad which enables access to second-cycle degree programmes in the country in which it was obtained. This must be submitted along with a transcript of records and a Diploma Supplement, where available, translated into Italian or English (no translation is required in case of degrees and transcripts originally written in French). If you have not yet obtained the aforementioned qualification, please apply for the Intake 4 and upload the list of completed exams or the Transcript of Records. Please specify your expected graduation date (which must be by and not later than November 18th 2024) in your CV.
- Certificate attesting to your English language competency (at least B2 level).
- Certificate attesting to your French language competency (at least B1 level).

OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS

- CV (curriculum vitae et studiorum) written in English.
- Copy of a valid residence permit, if already held.
- Adaptation request form for students with disabilities (only for programmes that entail meetings or exams). Further information is available at <u>https://site.unibo.it/studenti-condisabilita-e-dsa/en</u>

The Admission Board will only assess documents that have been uploaded within the online application. Any mandatory documents that are missing or only partially uploaded by the application deadline shall result in the candidate not being considered (or selected) for admission.

Documents must not be sent by post or email to administrative offices.

Graduating students: Only the **Intake 4** is open also to students who are about to graduate (who have completed all the exams and only have to take the final examination, where applicable), in this case, please follow the specific instructions:

NOTE FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS

Graduating students can apply <u>only for the Intake 4</u>, on the condition that they obtain their undergraduate degree by and no later than November 18th 2024. Graduating students are required to <u>indicate their expected graduation date in their application</u>.

The graduating student, after having successfully passed the interview of the Intake 4, must wait until graduation (at latest within November 18th 2024) and then send his/her final degree to <u>amac@unibo.it</u> in order to get the final grade checked by the Admission Board. Only after this final check and approval enrollment will be possible, within the final enrollment deadline established by the University of Bologna (November 21st 2024).

Candidates who do not meet this requirement will be excluded.

SECTION 3 – ADMISSION

An Admission Board will check candidates' academic backgrounds and whether they meet the requirements for admission.

Other professors of the AMaC curriculum may also sit on the committee as alternate members. Candidates will be notified about admission to the degree programme via Studenti Online (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>) and via email on their institutional email address <u>name.lastname@studio.unibo.it</u> starting from the date indicated under step 4 in the above intake calendar.

Candidates who are not admitted may apply for other intakes.

SECTION 4 – ENROLMENT

If you are admitted to the degree programme, you will be able to enrol starting from the date indicated at the end of each intake. In order to enrol, you should complete the following steps.

- 1. Log on to Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>) using your SPID credentials or entering the username and password obtained upon submission of your application.
- 2. Select "Enrolment", then select "Second-cycle Degree", and then the degree programme "Visual Arts" and enter the required data, attaching a jpg file containing a passport-size photo of your face. In case you made false statements you will incur in fines set by art. 496 of the Penal Code and you will automatically lose the right to enrol and will not be entitled to any financial aid (when obtained). You will not be refunded of the expenses you sustained.

3. Pay the first instalment following the instructions provided on Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>). After paying the enrolment fee, check the details of your enrolment application on Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>) to verify your next steps and activate your student career. Your student career must be activated by the deadline set on a yearly basis by the Academic Bodies, which is set on February 28, 2025 for a.y. 2024/25, otherwise your enrolment will be cancelled.

4.1 - Special cases

- If you are a University of Bologna graduate, the IT system will automatically update the data concerning graduation after you obtain the qualification.
- If you are graduating from a different institution, check your next steps on Studenti OnLine (www.studenti.unibo.it).
- If you are a non-EU citizen with EU-equivalent status and you have obtained your qualification in Italy you must provide the relevant <u>Student Administration Office</u> with a copy of your residence permit which confirms the EU-equivalent status.

The documentation which you submitted for admission to the degree programme (e.g. diploma, transcript of records...) must be translated and bear proof of authenticity when applicable https://www.unibo.it/en/teaching/enrolment-transfer-and-final-examination/translation-authenticity-and-value-of-foreign-qualifications.

You will need to upload the documents concerning your international qualification on Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>) in the section "Calls" by selecting "Matriculation for the 24_25 academic year - document upload for international students with foreign qualifications".

When you arrive at the University of Bologna, you will be required to make an appointment with the International Student Administration Office in Bologna or the Student Administration Office of your campus in order to show the original copies of your documentation.

- If you are a non-EU student living abroad, on top of the previous steps to complete, you must also pre-enrol on Universitaly and request an entry visa for study purposes. 5 TUITION AND FINANCIAL AID

5.1- Tuition fees

Information concerning the **amount of tuition fees**, **financial aid** and **fee waiver** are available on the University website at <u>www.unibo.it/Tasse</u>.

Tuition fees to be paid in order to enrol in a degree programme consist of a fixed part of \in 157.04 and a variable part which is calculated according to the economic situation of the household (ISEE) up to a maximum that varies depending on the degree programme.

Tuition fees are calculated progressively on the basis of a **valid ISEE certificate**, only if this is submitted in compliance with relevant regulations and within the deadlines, as detailed at

If no ISEE certificate is submitted, the maximum tuition envisaged for the degree programme will be applied.

ISEE submission is not linked to the enrolment process. The order in which you carry out the two procedures is irrelevant, as long as you meet the deadlines for each one.

5.2- ER.GO benefits

On a yearly basis, the **Regional Authority for the Right to Higher Education – ER.GO** publishes calls for grants, accommodation in student residences, meal vouchers and other benefits on the website <u>www.er-go.it.</u>

The procedures to request ER.GO benefits are also independent of the degree programme application and enrolment process.

You are strongly advised to do this because after the transfer/degree programme switch **your career will be evaluated starting from the first year of enrolment at University**, regardless of the recognised exams or the course year that you are admitted to. **This may cause the loss of benefits.**
