Brief overview of the degree programme

The Second Cycle Degree/Master Programme in Visual Arts is a 2-year (120 ECTS credits) free access Degree Programme with assessment of personal competencies and skills. It offers **two curricula**: **Arti Visive** (in Italian) and the **international curriculum** in **Arts, Museology and Curatorship (AMaC)** (in English and French).

The international curriculum in Arts, Museology and Curatorship (AMaC) is aimed at discussing the different methodologies in the fields of valorization of the arts, museology and curatorship in an international perspective. It provides training to students who wish to work in the various fields of the international artistic heritage and curatorship, as well as to those who plan to continue their training in schools of specialization and PhD programmes.

The teaching languages are English and French.

Candidates are expected to:

- have acquired a good humanistic culture permitting them to contextualize the artistic events from the medieval to the contemporary period;
- possess basic knowledge of the sources, methods and procedures of historical-artistic research;
- be able to correctly use the main basic instruments of information technologies and telematics;
- be able to communicate in a correct written and oral form.
- Candidates for the AMaC curriculum must have upper intermediate proficiency in English language (B2 or equivalent) and at least intermediate knowledge of the French language (B1 or equivalent).

SECTION 1 – ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission, applicants must:

- a) hold a first-cycle ACADEMIC QUALIFICATION, i.e., a three-year University degree or diploma or other suitable qualification obtained abroad.
 - Applicants not yet graduated can apply **only for the Intake 4**. See section 2 "How to apply" for further details;
- b) meet the **CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS** outlined in section 1.1;
- c) meet the **LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS** and, specifically, proficiency in **English** equivalent to at least **B2 level** and proficiency in **French** equivalent to at least **B1 level**, to be demonstrated according to the procedures set out in section 1.1;
- d) have their **PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS** positively assessed in accordance with the procedures set out in section 1.2.

1.1- Curricular and language requirements

CURRICULAR REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for admission, candidates must:

If the candidate holds an Italian "Diploma accademico di I livello dell'Accademia di Belle Arti" (ex lege 508/99) or an Italian university degree achieved within the previous four-year system, the Admission Board will evaluate and verify the possession of the required knowledge and skills on the basis of the previous career.

For students with a qualification obtained abroad, the assessment of the admission requirements (compatibility of the degree with respect to the degree classes indicated, evaluation of the curriculum, credits and learning results with respect to the required competences and subject areas, final evaluation achieved) will take place by examining the curriculum.

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Admission to the programme is subject to proving **English** language skills, equivalent to level **B2** (or higher) of the Common European Framework (CEFR) and **French** language skills equivalent to level **B1** (or higher) of the Common European Framework (CEFR).

The **English language** requirement may be satisfied through:

- Native English speaker;
- Bachelor's degree with English as means of instruction.

The **French language** requirement may be satisfied through:

- B1 level certified by previous academic studies;
- Bachelor's degree with French as means of instruction;
- ESABAC certification (as established by the convention of 24/01/2009 between the Italian Ministry of education, university and research and the French Ministry of Education);
- Native French speaker;

1.2- Assessment of personal knowledge and skills

- For candidates with Italian qualification, a final Bachelor grade of 95/110 or higher is required.
- For all candidates, an interview is required in order to furtherly assess the candidates' personal competencies and skills.

Attention: the interview is compulsory for all candidates!

The interview aims to furtherly assess the candidates' personal competencies and skills (candidates are expected to have acquired a good humanistic culture permitting them to contextualize the artistic events from the medieval to the contemporary period and to possess basic knowledge of the sources, methods and procedures of historical-artistic research).

The interview will last around 15 minutes and will be conducted remotely (in English and French).

During the interview the Admission Board will evaluate in particular:

- The coherence of candidates' previous academic studies/Bachelor's dissertation topic with the AMaC curriculum;
- The candidates' basic academic knowledge about contemporary arts, exhibitions and museums;
- The candidates' direct experience/knowledge about recent events in the arts world (exhibitions, museums, art events etc.).

SECTION 2 – HOW TO APPLY

Applications must be submitted within the timeframe set by each intake in accordance with the following procedure.

- **1. Log onto** Studenti OnLine (www.studenti.unibo.it), using your SPID username and password. The system will automatically retrieve your personal details and it will create your University credentials (nome.cognome@studio.unibo.it).
 - International students who do not have an ID document issued in Italy and, therefore, cannot obtain SPID credentials, may log in with their University username and password which can be obtained by going to www.studenti.unibo.it and clicking on *Register* and then *International students registration*
- 2. Click on "APPLY FOR ADMISSION", select "SECOND-CYCLE DEGREE" and choose the programme named "VISUAL ARTS ARTS, MUSEOLOGY AND CURATORSHIP (AMaC) International Curriculum, Admission process" (all intake sessions are listed, but you can only select the intake open at the moment of your access);
- 3. UPLOAD the required documents in PDF format:

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- For students holding a qualification obtained outside the University of Bologna A copy of the
 front and back of a valid identity document. If the identity document does not have an English
 translation, a copy of your passport must be attached.
- For students holding a qualification obtained outside the University of Bologna Self-certification regarding your first-cycle academic qualification with a list of completed exams, if obtained in Italy, or a copy of the qualification obtained abroad which enables access to second-cycle degree programmes in the country in which it was obtained. This must be submitted along with a Transcript of Records and a Diploma Supplement, where available, translated into Italian or English (no translation is required in case of degrees and transcripts originally written in French). If you have not yet obtained the aforementioned qualification, please apply for the Intake 4 and upload the list of exams taken or the Transcript of Records. Please specify your expected graduation date (which must be by and no later than November 20th 2023) in your CV.
- CV (curriculum vitae et studiorum) written in English.
- Certification attesting to your English language competency (at least B2 level).
- Certification attesting to your French language competency (at least B1 level).

OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS

Copy of a valid residence permit, if already held.

The Admission Board will only assess documents uploaded through the online application. Any mandatory documents that are missing or only partially uploaded by the application deadline shall result in the candidate not being considered (or selected) for admission.

Documents must not be sent by post or email to administrative offices.

Graduating students: Only the **Intake 4** is open also to students who are about to graduate, in this case, please follow the specific instructions:

NOTE FOR GRADUATING STUDENTS

Graduating students can apply only for the Intake 4, on the condition that they obtain their undergraduate degree by and no later than November 20th 2023. Graduating students are required to indicate their expected graduation date in their application.

The graduating student, after having successfully passed the interview of the Intake 4, must wait until graduation (at latest within November 20th 2023) and then send his/her final degree to amac@unibo.it in order to get the final grade checked by the Admission Board. Only after this final check and approval enrollment will be possible, within the final enrollment deadline established by the University of Bologna (November 23rd 2023).

Candidates who do not meet this requirement will be excluded.

SECTION 3 – ADMISSION

An Admission Board will check candidates' academic backgrounds and whether they meet the requirements for admission.

Candidates will be notified about admission to the degree programme via Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it) and via email on their institutional email address name.lastname@studio.unibo.it.

Candidates who are not admitted may apply for other intakes.

SECTION 4 – ENROLMENT

To enrol, you should complete the following steps:

- 1. **Log on** to Studenti OnLine (<u>www.studenti.unibo.it</u>) entering the username and password obtained when submitting your application.
- 2. **Select "Enrolment"**, then select "Second-cycle Degree", and then the degree programme "Visual Arts" and enter the required data, attaching a jpg file containing a passport-size photo of your face. In case you made false statements you will incur in fines set by art. 496 of the Penal Code and you will automatically lose the right to enrol and will not be entitled to any financial aid (when obtained). You will not be refunded of the expenses you sustained.
- 3. **Pay the first instalment** following the instructions provided on Studenti Online (www.studenti.unibo.it).

After paying the enrolment fee, check the details of your enrolment application on Studenti OnLine (www.studenti.unibo.it) to verify your next steps and activate your career.

Your University career must be activated by the deadline set on a yearly basis by the Academic Bodies, otherwise your enrolment will be cancelled.

4.1 - Particular cases

- If you hold a certificate demonstrating recognised invalidity of at least 66% or a certificate complying with Law 104/92, in order to benefit from the exemption detailed at https://www.unibo.it/it/servizi-e-opportunita/borse-di-studio-e-agevolazioni/esoneri-e-incentivi/esenzioni-per-studenti-portatori-di-handicap, upon enrolment you should send the certificate via email to the relevant Student Administration Office.
- If you are a non-EU citizen with EU-equivalent status and you have obtained your qualification in Italy you must provide the relevant Student Administration Office with a copy of your residence permit which confirms the EU-equivalent status.
- If you hold an international qualification, after completing the above steps, check the <u>required</u> <u>documentation</u> to enrol (link: <u>https://www.unibo.it/it/didattica/iscrizioni-trasferimenti-e-laurea/iscriversi-corso-di-laurea-magistrale-con-titolo-estero</u>).

The documentation which you submitted for admission to the degree programme (e.g. diploma, transcript of records...) must be translated and bear proof of authenticity when applicable.

You will need to upload the documents concerning your international qualification on Studenti OnLine (www.studenti.unibo.it) in the section "Calls" by selecting "Matriculation for the 23_24 academic year - document upload for international students with foreign qualifications".

When you arrive at the University of Bologna, you must make an appointment with the International Student Administration Office in Bologna in order to show the original copies of your documentation.
