The Programme

Purpose

- Mobility students receive a **grant** and can **attend courses** and **use structures** at the host institute **without additional enrolment fees**.
- Students are also **guaranteed full recognition of the learning activities** carried out abroad, on the condition that they were approved in advance by the Degree Programme Board (Learning Agreement).
- The Erasmus+ Programme makes it possible for students to experience a **different culture abroad, learn a new language, explore different higher education systems** and meet young **people from other countries**, participating actively in the process of European integration and cooperation.



Destinations

- EU countries participating in the Erasmus+ Programme

Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland, Sweden.

- Third countries associated to the programme:

- North Macedonia, Serbia, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Turkey

- United Kingdom and Switzerland

- Non-EU countries

United Kingdom

The students who will be selected for an exchange in an UK partner university must take into consideration the following:

- they must respect the **entry rules** to the United Kingdom and, therefore, it will be necessary to inquire regarding the **VISA** and **health insurance**
<https://www.gov.uk/check-uk-visa>;
- **health insurance and VISA fees** (around £348), along with other costs related to the entrance to UK or to the acceptance by the UK university will not be covered by the University of Bologna;
- in most of the cases, UK universities ask for **language certificates** order to release invitation letters for VISA (IELTS, CAE, etc.) in purposes, based on the exchange duration. We suggest students to check accurately the relevant webpages of the UK universities and, in case of doubts, to contact them directly to get more information.



Funding

- Funding represents a **grant towards the additional expenses associated with living abroad.**
- All funding is allocated in order to carry out eligible activities with a duration of:
 - no less than **2 months (60 days)** for all countries
 - no more than **12 months** regardless the country of destination.

**The Erasmus+ mobility must take place within
01/06/2026 and 31/07/2027**

- Erasmus+ funding is also dependent on the activities carried out abroad and on their **recognition** by the student's Degree Programme Board.




Funding

- It is calculated based on the destination country and the actual number of days spent at the partner university;
- It is granted for mobility periods of at least 60 days;
- Funding for any extensions of the study period is not guaranteed;
- The scholarship is conditional upon the recognition of at least one UNIBO learning activity in your academic record at the end of the mobility period;
- If no activity is recognized (including cases where recognition is not requested or is refused), the entire scholarship must be returned.

Eligibility Requirements

In order to submit an application:

- **students must be enrolled at UNIBO in the 2025/26 academic year**, regardless of the country of citizenship. The student must maintain the requisite of the enrolment for the entire duration of application/selection procedure until the publication of ranking lists;
- **students must possess adequate language skills**; the requisite of language skills must be satisfied before the deadline of this Call for applications;
- students must present a **study plan** to be followed at the partner institute and a related **motivation letter** (one single file);
- **students must renew their enrolment at UNIBO for the 2026/27 academic year**



Incompatibilities



Students who submit an application:

- may obtain one or more Erasmus+ grants for each study cycle (three-year, graduate and doctorate) covering a total period that does not exceed 12 months in each cycle.
- The calculation of the number of months already used in the same cycle must take account of any earlier mobility as part of the following programmes: Lifelong Learning Programme, Erasmus+, Erasmus Mundus Action 1, Erasmus Mundus Action 2.



may not receive, during the same period in which they receive funding for the Erasmus+ project, any other types of EU grants (including scholarships for Joint Master Degrees - pursuant to Erasmus Mundus Action 1) or grants allocated from the UNIBO funds available for mobility periods abroad, or PON, PNRR funds.



Within the same academic year, students may benefit from additional exchange opportunities with the same purpose (e.g., Erasmus+ Traineeship); the mobilities can be consecutive but must not overlap.

Language requirements



IMPORTANT: If you are applying for mobility programme where the required language is English and you are a LEGS student, you are not required to take a test to prove your English language skills.

- However, if you are applying for mobility programme where the required language is different from English, UNIBO requires a **compulsory assessment of your language skills**. A **minimum level of language skills** is required in order to apply for an Erasmus+ grant. This standard has been set at the **A2 level** of the Common Frame of Reference for language knowledge as recognised by the European Council.
- The test result is an eligibility requirement but will also be used for the **evaluation of the application**.
- **Candidates may sit the test for up to 2 languages (only once for each language)**. For exchange vacancies in which two languages are indicated, candidates may choose to sit the test in either of these languages.
- Further information and support about the language assessment are available through the helpdesk service and information can be requested via email by diri.accertamentilinguistici@unibo.it.
- **All students are required to sit a language test** and achieve at least the A2 level unless they are included in the **exempt categories listed in Attachment 1**.

Language requirements



All candidates who fail to meet the language requirements (language assessments and any exemptions specified in Attachment 1) will be considered incomplete and excluded.

The requisite must be satisfied before the deadline of this Call for Applications.

PLEASE NOTE

- The language requirements must be met in order for an application to be eligible. However, **Unibo requirements may be lower than those of Partner Universities.** Students are therefore required to:
 1. check the language requirements of the host university
 2. check the details of the individual exchange opportunity for the minimum language level (if any) required by the academic coordinator for inclusion on the list of eligible candidates.
- this level may be higher than that required by the University of Bologna for participation in the call for applications (A2).
- If the score of the language assessment test is lower than the level specified in the details of the vacancy which the student has applied to, the **application may be rejected** by the exchange coordinator.



Language Requirements - Exemptions from Sitting the Assessment Test

Students are exempt from taking language assessment tests if they:

- Have passed a curricular language pass/fail test (IDONEITA') as part of their study plan, in the language requested by the mobility programme. Test passed before 1/1/2021 will not be considered valid as exemption from the language test. For students enrolled at the first year of a second cycle degree (Laurea Magistrale) the language test passed during their first cycle degree can be considered valid if passed not before 1/1/2021, even if obtained at another Italian university.
- Have been awarded an official certificate issued by one of the Certifying Bodies in the table of equivalence of the *Common European Framework of Reference* (Attachment 3). Certificates issued before 1/1/2021 will not be considered, regardless of the official validity period established by the certifying body;
- ✗ **Are enrolled in degree programmes taught entirely in English (listed in Attachment 4). This option is valid only for students applying for mobility programmes where the required language is English. Students in this category who apply for institutes that do not offer English as a testing language will nonetheless have to submit adequate certification (or sit the assessment test);**
- Have been awarded a certificate after attending a **50-hour course at the University Language Centre (CLA)**. Certificates issued before 1/1/2021 will not be considered;
- Have passed a language assessment test at the University of Bologna Language Centre (CLA) after 1/1/2021 for other calls for applications for mobility programs (Erasmus+ for study, Erasmus+ for traineeship, Overseas, Fieldwork).

Exemptions



- are enrolled in a **third-cycle programme** (PhD programme or specialization school) at the University of Bologna;
- Have obtained an **ESABAC diploma** (certification valid only for students applying for mobility programmes where the required language is French); students are advised to upload in the application the certificate released by the Italian secondary school with the statement of the obtained ESABAC
- Have obtained a high school diploma from an Italian secondary school with international option for the languages English, French, German, Spanish and Portuguese (for example: high school diploma under the the option “Cambridge ICSE”, high school diploma from the Istituto Galvani in Bologna - International Section, English and German and similar diplomas).
- Have been awarded the **bilingual certification for German language** issued by the autonomous **province of Bolzano** or the Deutsches Sprachdiplom (DSD) der Kultusministerkonferenz, testing the four skills (certifications valid only for students applying for mobility programmes where the required language is German).




Have obtained abroad a high school diploma or a first cycle degree in the language requested by the exchange vacancy (English, French, German, Spanish and Portuguese). Warning: the diploma uploaded in the application should display the language in which the diploma/degree has been obtained.



Destinations

- The **list of destinations** and their descriptions are **published online** and are an integral part of the call for applications. These vacancies specify the **destination, name of the exchange coordinator, exchange field of study, language requirements specific to the destination** (if any), academic requirements or a list of degree programmes which grant access to the vacancy.
- Students may apply for a **maximum of 3 different vacancies**.
- **Log in to ALMA RM with your credentials**, not through the public link, so you will only have access to the opportunities you can apply for.
- Vacancies are subject to change while the call for applications is open, when significant changes are communicated by the hosting partner university.
- **The year of the offer refers to the year in which the mobility will take place**
- If the vacancy requires a "**compulsory interview**", this means that the interview with the exchange coordinator must take place before submitting the application (unless otherwise specified). Failure to attend the interview before submitting an application may result in rejection of the application.
- The Erasmus+ grant is **conditional to admission at the hosting university**. If the nominated exchange student's application is rejected by the hosting university, the student will not be re-allocated to another destination. It is the student's responsibility to verify the **specific requirements** (language and academic requirements, enrolment procedures) and application **submission deadlines** by checking the official university web page or by contacting the host university.


The call for applications for Erasmus+ for Studies 2026/2027 is now open and you can consult all the available exchange vacancies online.

Remember: you can apply for **THREE** different exchange vacancies – use them all to join the Erasmus Generation!



Check the offer sheet and the notes containing information regarding:

- Required language skills
- Academic activities and deadlines at partner universities
- Any mandatory interview requested by the exchange program coordinator
- Take into account the number of applications received in previous years and make informed decisions when selecting your 3 options.



Activities to be carried out at the university abroad

- Students must indicate which **activities** they wish to carry out abroad when submitting their application. This information is **indicative** and does not prevent students from choosing other activities for their official Learning Agreement, which must be approved by the relevant Degree Programme before departure.

As such, the activities permitted during the mobility period for study are:

- **learning activities** (EXAMS)
- **preparation of a dissertation** (not to be included in the LA)



The Erasmus Study mobility period is to be considered as continuous: during the mobility period, students are required to mainly carry out the activities included in the Learning Agreement at the host university. The possibility to sit exams or other learning activities in Italy must be agreed upon by the host university, with the student's Exchange Coordinator and with the student's Degree Program Coordinator.



Submitting an application

- Each candidate may submit applications for a maximum of three different vacancies. Applications must be submitted online only through **AlmaRM** (<https://almarm.unibo.it>), starting from **8 January 2026**, and following the guided procedure.





Submitting an application


In order to apply, candidates must:

- access the **AlmaRM** application using institutional credentials;
- **read the notes** for filling in applications on the AlmaRM homepage, which explain how to apply online;
- **upload the following documents** to AlmaRM:
 - **Self-certification of the applicant's degree certificate with a list of exams**, ONLY if the first- or second-cycle degree was obtained from another university.
 - A **personal study plan** for the mobility period and a **motivation letter (one single PDF file)**. The document template can be downloaded from AlmaRM.
 - Any **other attachments** deemed useful for assessment purposes.
 - A **language certificate** or other to claim the exemption from the language test, as indicated in Attachment 1 and 3 to the Call for applications (ONLY if required by AlmaRM). The results of language assessment tests sat at the CLA will be obtained directly by the Mobility for Study Office.
- All documents must be uploaded to AlmaRM in **pdf format** when submitting the application. Failure to do so may result in the application being rejected.
- Incomplete applications will not be accepted and it will not be possible to change or cancel applications after submission.



Submitting an application

- Consult the course offerings of the Host University.
- Review the recognition rules for activities undertaken abroad for your Degree Program: Rules for the recognition of the learning activities – LEGS
- **IT WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE TO MODIFY OR CANCEL THE FINALIZED APPLICATIONS**
- ALMA RM automatically blocks the application of students with a remaining number of mobility days for their study cycle that is below the minimum required (60 days).
- Students with ongoing mobility (study or internship) will receive a message on screen informing them of this rule, as the remaining days cannot be calculated. They will still be able to proceed with submitting their application.



Submitting an application

The application can be «SALVATA PROVVISORIAMENTE» (SAVED PROVISIONALLY)" and then modified, completed, or canceled.

Submitting an application

- **Email Notification of Successful Application Submission**
Once your application has been successfully submitted, an automatic notification will be sent to your institutional email address (nome.cognome@studio.unibo.it)
- **Keep the unique identifier of your application!** It will be used for the anonymized publication of the rankings! If you need to retrieve it, you can find it in your ALMA RM page! It will be needed to determine whether you have been selected!

Award Criteria

The award criteria are:

1. Evaluation by the exchange coordinator (up to a maximum of 40 points) on:

- a) the **compatibility** of the **study plan** with the individual candidate's course of study, the compatibility with the programme catalogue of the host university, and the length of stay;
- b) **motivation** as specified in the application or during the assessment interview (if required);
- c) the **interview**, if compulsory (per the vacancy description)
- d) **language abilities**;
- e) **other elements** specified by the student in the application or during the interview (additional learning/educational experiences, specific academic interests, etc.).

2. Academic assessment (up to a maximum of 60 points) based on regularity of studies and course credits in compliance with methods described below

With regard to students' current course of study, the following is considered: for progress, the normalised average, and for regularity, the number of credits earned during their career as of

11 February 2026 11:59 p.m. Italian time



Acceptance

It is the student's responsibility to:

- Log in to ALMA RM using their institutional credentials.
- Access the published rankings.
- Find their unique application identification number.
- Register the acceptance or refusal of the exchange position.
- Indicate the exchange period (1st semester, 2nd semester, or full year).
- **Respect the deadlines for the 3 rounds of exchange acceptance!**

You can only accept one exchange position.

Once the acceptance or refusal has been formalized, you cannot change your choice.

After confirming the acceptance, the student will receive a confirmation email.

Failure to accept or refuse the exchange position will result in exclusion from the ranking.



DEADLINES

- **16 January 2026, at 1 pm**

Deadline for Registrations for the University Language Centre - CLA tests

- **5 February 2026, at 1pm**

Deadline for the submission of applications.

- **11 February 2026**

Date within which exams must be properly registered in the students' careers in order to be considered for evaluation.

- **5 March 2026**

Publication of rankings on AlmaRM.

- **11 March 2026, at 1pm**

Deadline to accept a placement with reference to the ranking lists published on 5 March 2026.

- **12 March 2026**

Publication of updated ranking lists on AlmaRM.

- **18 March 2026, at 1pm**

Deadline to accept placements from the updated ranked list published on 12 March 2026.

- **19 March 2026**

After the second round of acceptance (ended on 18 March 2026), ranked lists will be updated again and the students who became eligible for accepting the exchange place will receive an automatic email.

- **25 March 2026, at 1pm**

Deadline to accept placements after the receipt of the automatic email sent on 19 March 2026.

- **From 26 March 2026**

Communication of the names of the successful candidates to the Partner Universities.


