Admission requirements

Applicants must hold a 1st cycle University Degree or equivalent in one of the following subjects: Law, Economics, Social and Political Sciences, Humanities. Applicants must have a certified knowledge of English (B2 level and above). Admission is subject to the assessment of a suitable personal preparation based on the documents submitted by the candidates.

Programme content

The programme lasts two years and is divided in four semesters. The first and second semester take place at the University of Bologna, Forlì Campus.

During the third semester students carry out a compulsory mobility of at least 5 months at one of the partner or associate universities.

The fourth semester is devoted to research and thesis writing. Students' mobility is also fostered by various opportunities offered by the programme, such as research grants for the participation in international conferences and seminars as panelists as well as the possibility to carry out internships or additional mobility experiences for the preparation of the thesis.

Career opportunities

MIREES prepares students for careers at the European Union institutions, international agencies, voluntary organizations and NGOs, public administration, private companies doing business in East-Central Europe and Russia/CIS.

MIREES is also recommended for prospective PhD students. Some of our best alumni are currently attending doctoral programmes at the University of Oxford, Harvard University, the New School in New York, European University Institute and at other prestigious universities around the world.
