The seminar, co-funded by the Europe for Citizens Programme of the European Union, will offer 20 Master students and graduates an opportunity to gain first-hand insights from researchers, EU practitioners, policymakers and officials on digital policies.

#### By attending this seminar, you will:

- Acquire and deepen your knowledge on EU digital policies touching topics such as the digital single market, data protection, and cyberwarfare, gaining valuable insights into the practicalities of policy-making in Brussels;
- Meet high-level professionals from EU institutions and thinktanks and learn from their experiences;
- Meet and exchange views with students from different disciplinary and national backgrounds;
- Improve your analytical and argumentation skills;
- Enhance your employability.



# Date, location and format of the Seminar

The seminar is a 4-day event. It will be held in Brussels from Tuesday 26 to Friday 29 October 2021. In case of restrictions due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the seminar will be organised online using the ZOOM platform. A certificate will be issued to all participants following their full attendance at the seminar.

The four days will be devoted to attending expert lectures, panel debates, and meeting practitioners from key EU institutions, thinktanks, and civil society organisations, with the objective of complementing the insights gained during the lectures. Participants will also have the opportunity to attend a networking and career event.

Throughout the seminar, dedicated sessions for analysis and discussion in the group will be provided in order to allow participants to critically reflect on the insights gained during the lectures and online meetings. A draft agenda of the seminar can be found at the end of this document. Please note that this is a draft that can be subject to changes.

The seminar is organised by TEPSA under the academic lead of Andrea Garcia Rodríguez, Researcher and Project Manger at the Barcelona Center for International Affairs (CIDOB).



### **Application Procedure**

The EU@Work Seminar is designed as an interdisciplinary seminar and is open for 20 Master's students and recent graduates from different disciplines (e.g. Political Science, European Studies, International Relations, Law, Economics) interested in learning more about the EU Digital Policy.
