The common purpose of the four events the Re-Globe Seminar Cycle in Ravenna is to present and analyse how the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) of the UN 2030 Agenda are considered within the EU trade policy, and more generally in the EU external relations. Four young researchers -Dr. Niccolò Lanzoni, PhD Candidates Alessandra Quarta and Klarissa Martins, and Ms Giulia Bortino- will present their research devoted to cultural heritage in the new generation of the EU Preferential Trade Agreements (PTAs), women empowerment in the WTO and EU PTAs, corporate social responsibility in the EU trade policy, and the protection of cultural and natural heritage in danger in International and European Law.

In all the four events, Prof. Elisa Baroncini will introduce the lecturers and be their discussant.
