International Research Seminar in Maritime, Transport & Mobility Law

AIMS

The aims of the international research seminar are many. First, it will offer PhD-students an opportunity to present their on-going research to each other and to receive valuable feedback on their on-going work from their fellow PhD-researchers from the fields of maritime, transport and mobility law. Second, each morning the program starts with an in-depth master class given by leading law professor on subjects of current interest.

Third, on the Friday the PhD-students may participate free of charge in the "Colloquium on Recent Trends in European Port, Maritime, Transport and Mobility Law", where a selection of recently graduated scholars will present the most significant findings of their PhD-thesis.

Fourth, during the seminar participants will have excellent networking opportunities to improve or extend their international academic contacts in the fields of maritime, transport and mobility law.

CMI PRIZE

A prize for the best contestant among the PhD-students has been offered by the Comité Maritime International (CMI) and the organizers.

The winner will be invited to speak at the Young CMI event in Dublin on 1 October 2013 and will receive financial support to enable him or her in order to attend the Joint Symposium of CMI & the Irish Maritime Law Association to be held at Dublin, Ireland from 30 September until 2 October 2013.

TARGET GROUP

PhD-Students in the fields of maritime, transport and mobility law (both private and public law and including procedural law, jurisdiction and conflict law) from all over the World. The international research seminar is also open for attendance by advanced law students of at least master level who have already successfully completed their course(s) in Maritime and/or Transport Law and who are interested in specializing further in these matters. The Friday Colloquium is open also to academics, legal practitioners and law students generally.

BASIC SET-UP

The time slots available for the various presentations by PhD-students are determined and communicated later when the total number of participants is known. Presentations will be grouped together in sessions based upon the subject-matter. If necessary, parallel sessions will be scheduled to allow all PhD-students to present their research and obtain feedback from the audience. The organizers must however reserve the right to reject admissions if the subjectmatter is insufficiently related to the fields of maritime, transport and mobility law.

MASTERCLASS

From the organizing and supporting universities, four distinguished law professors have been confirmed to give a master class to the participants of the International Research Seminar on topical subjects. The idea is to provide high level teaching to the PhD-students and advanced master students who in turn are expected to prepare for and

participate actively in discussion during the master class. This year's confirmed speakers are: Prof. Dr. Michele Comenale Pinto (Sassari), emeritus Prof. Dr. Krijn Haak (Rotterdam), Prof. Dr. Henrik Ringbom (Oslo), and emeritus Prof. Dr. Rhidian Thomas (Swansea).
