## BEHAVIOUR

- Comply with the institutional rules and regulations regarding workplace hygiene, health, and safety;
- Comply with privacy rules when dealing with any data and information during clinical rotations.

## DRESS CODE

Students attending clinical rotations must wear a white coat, in compliance with institutional rules and regulations on workplace hygiene. White coats are not provided by teaching hospitals. Access to the operating theatre sections (Blocchi Operatori) of the S.Orsola-Malpighi teaching

hospital is permitted only when wearing the required TTR uniforms. TTR uniforms are provided directly by the departments.
