

Regulations for the Practical Evaluation Test for Professional Qualification

Article 1- Purpose and Objectives

The **Practical Evaluation Test (PPV)** takes place before thesis defense and aims to assess the candidate's ability to apply a professional approach based on theoretical models and empirical evidence. It also evaluates adherence to ethical principles, professional responsibilities, and conduct rules of the psychology profession. Additionally, it assesses the candidate's ability to critically reflect on their internship experience and related activities.

Article 2- Admission Requirements

Candidates must have already **applied for graduation** and completed all required coursework before registering for the PPV. Registration is done via AlmaEsami, according to the university location and the candidate's specific **Master's Degree Program (CdLM)**.

Candidates may only register for the PPV assigned to their specific Master's Degree Program, even if multiple examination committees operate during a session. It is **not possible** to take the PPV with a different committee than the one designated for the specific Master's Degree Program.

Only candidates who meet all eligibility requirements are allowed to take the PPV.

Article 3- Exam Format

The **PPV** is an oral examination, focusing on:

- activities performed during the **Practical Training Evaluation (TPV)**;
- the connection between theories/models and professional practices;
- aspects of legislation and professional ethics.

The candidate will be examined by a committee of four members, including:

- two university professors from psychology-related disciplines, one of whom acts as the **President**;
- two members from the Order of Psychologists of the Emilia-Romagna Region.

The PPV is conducted in person at the Bologna or Cesena Campus, depending on the location of the Master's Degree Program.

Only candidates residing abroad and enrolled in a double-degree or international Master's program are allowed to take the PPV remotely.

Only candidates enrolled in international or double-degree Master's programs may request to take the PPV in English. Candidates must specify their language preference (English or Italian) when submitting their graduation application or PPV registration.

The PPV result is either pass (idoneità) or fail (non idoneità).

Candidates who fail may retake the PPV in the next available session. Once the PPV is passed and recorded in AlmaEsami, the candidate is eligible to proceed with the thesis defense, provided they upload their thesis to **Studenti Online** and receive approval from their thesis supervisor according to the university's established procedures and deadlines.

Article 4- Exam Schedule

The PPV is held once per graduation session, with three sessions per academic year:

- 1. winter session:
- 2. summer session;
- 3. autumn session.

The PPV schedule is published at the start of the academic year, alongside the schedule for graduation sessions.
