

This teaching module provides the following elements, which are useful for achieving **EAEVE Day One Competences**

1.21 Assess the physical condition, welfare and nutritional status of an animal or group of animals and advise the client on principles of husbandry, feeding, reproduction, production, welfare, individual health, herd health and public health.

- The student correctly assesses the housing conditions in broilers
- The student correctly assesses the housing condition in laying hens
- The student correctly assesses welfare in broilers
- The student correctly assesses welfare in hens

1.34 Perform necropsy in all common animal species, including sampling, dispatching and reporting.

- The student correctly performs a necropsy on the carcass of a poultry species

1.35 Perform ante-mortem inspection of food-producing animals including paying attention to welfare aspects, systematic gross post-mortem examination, record observations, sample tissues, store and transport them.

- The student knows whether animal welfare rules have been laid down during transport, unloading, handling and stocking of poultry species
- The student is able to assess the correct stunning of poultry species
- The student is able to verify the documents of poultry and rabbits (FCI, model 4) in order to allow the slaughtering process or to adopt specific measures
- The student must be able to assess Correct Welfare Practices in the poultry slaughterhouse and to apply correctly the European Legislation about Animal Welfare
